The Resurrection Morning



Easter is more than chocolate eggs. It's true! Jesus has Risen from the dead. This is the astounding message for which Christians praise God and on which they base their hope for life eternal.

Certainly on that first Easter morning Mary of Magdala got the surprise of her life. It was unbelievable that the man she had recently seen crucified should now speak to her in the garden area

beside the tomb. And yet the 'impossible' was something that she, and then the other disciples, had to accept. Jesus was alive! The resurrection morning turned her understanding of reality upside down.

It was not just a bizarre incident, but a miracle with a meaning. It meant that the prophecies of the Old Testament had been fulfilled and that God had endorsed the words and works of Jesus. He is both the 'Messiah of the Jews' and the 'Saviour of the world'.

The temptation of our age is to try and explain away this claim to an historic, objective and eternal truth. But in the resurrection of Jesus we are confronted by an inconvenient God who makes us think anew. And wonderfully it is not just to a change of our mental landscape that God calls us. We are helped to receive inner healing from guilt and sin through the Holy Spirit and renewed in our relationship with others around us. As Spring refreshes our world with life so at Easter we celebrate – because the God who raised Jesus can bring us also to refreshment and resurrection. New life, New Love, New Joy, New Hope, surge through us. Jesus never died after this. Jesus lives to be our friend. He provides us with purpose in living and hope for an eternal future.

Wonderful though the offer of personal salvation is – and each of us must respond individually – there is a community aspect to this also: Jesus died to save all mankind. We need to love others, work alongside others and serve the many who live in poverty and ignorance in our needy world. Easter reminds us we are here to proclaim new life to all: It's true! Jesus lives – so we may too!

Annual General Meeting



This year the Annual General Meeting will be on Sunday 29th April at 12.00noon - after our usual 10.30am main Morning Service. It begins with the election (or re-election) of Churchwardens, considers the reports and accounts for 2017, and continues with the election of PCC members for the year ahead. This is your chance to see how the church has been run, ask questions and choose those who will hold office in the coming year.

We will aim to have the Financial Accounts and Annual report ready to read a fortnight after Easter. Please bring all papers back for the AGM!

Please also encourage suitable people for all the positions above and think about whether you might like to contribute. We would like to find an electoral roll officer, an assistant treasurer, another representative for Deanery Synod and 3 new PCC members. Pray that we may know God's guidance and provision for the year ahead – and bring the life-giving message of God's love to our community.

Repairs to Stonework

Pointing and maintenance for the walls of the south aisle and Tower are set to get underway this month. Subject to final details being agreed between architect and contractor, we hope the work will begin on April 16th. This will include the erection of appropriate scaffolding. At the moment the walls are severely impacted by damage from water erosion and masonry bees. Finance for this phase of the repairs (approx. £30,000) has been raised through the Friends of the Church, The Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust, Co-op community funding, The Francis Coales Charitable Fund, and other donors. After treatment we hope these exterior walls will remain in good shape for many years to come.

Easter Cracked 2018

On Monday afternoon, 19th March, 60 children from Year 4 at Cranfield Academy ventured over to the Parish Church to 'crack the meaning of Easter'. Rachel Foster and Pastor Steve from the Baptist church with Liz Symes-Thompson and the Rector were assisted by some of the regulars from 'Open the Book' in an entertaining and exciting presentation. There were quizzes and games, stories and activities. The children's awe and wonder during the Roman Centurion's (Pastor Steve) retelling of the crucifixion was again a joy to behold. Making a palm cross each to take home proved easier for children than some helpers. At the end the children wrote down something they had learned about what Easter means for Christians. As ever they left eggcitedly!
